TENNIS

1.0 Tennis Facilities

The IronOaks tennis facility sites consists of 14 (fourteen) tennis courts located in Oakwood and 2 (two) tennis courts located in Ironwood. The club tennis professional is located in the Oakwood facility in the IronOaks Health Club building facility. The facilities are owned by IronOaks Homeowners Association and their use is under the jurisdiction of the IronOaks Board of Directors.

Proper tennis attire, including shirts, and smooth-soled, non-marking tennis shoes must be worn.

Children under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by an adult at all times. The tennis courts are to be used for tennis only. Skateboarding, rollerblading, and other similar sports or activities are not allowed on the courts.

No smoking or alcoholic beverages are permitted on the courts.

IRONWOOD COURTS

Ironwood Courts may be used by IronOaks residents and their guests according to the rules posted at the Ironwood courts.

The courts are available on a first-come basis. Players must write their names on the blackboard indicating their time on and their time off the court. Doubles court time is limited to 1.5 hours; singles are limited to one (1) hour of court time if others are waiting.

OAKWOOD TENNIS COURTS

Oakwood courts may be reserved by Tennis Club Members according to the criteria listed below. Non-Members may not reserve courts. If courts are not reserved by Members, they may be used by IronOaks residents on a first come basis as described in Section 1.6 below.

1.1 Tennis Membership

Individuals who have paid the annual fee set by the IronOaks Board of Directors will be considered Tennis Club Members. Members may reserve Oakwood courts in advance according the reservation system described below. Members may use the ball machine. Members have access to the sauna, spa and lap pool as part of their membership.

1.2 Prime Time and Open Time

Oakwood court hours shall be designated as Prime Time and Open Time.

- Prime time shall consist of the first six hours of scheduled play time each day and will be scheduled in four (4) one and one half hour court sessions.
- From October through April prime time will be 7:30 am to 1:30 pm. From May through September prime time hours may be adjusted based on a consensus recommendation of the Members.
- Open Time shall consist of all hours after Prime Time until 10PM.

1.3 Court reservation system for Tennis Club Members

Oakwood courts may be reserved by Tennis Club Members for one and one half hours. IronOaks Tennis Club Members are allowed to make reservations for court time any time after 1 pm two days in advance of the date of play. Non-Members may not make reservations. Section 1.6 below describes walk-on options for non-Members

Holders of the reservation must claim the court within 10 min of the scheduled start time or the court will be considered unused and may be reassigned.

1.4 Court reservations for Group Programs and Leagues

Organized group programs and leagues are those programs that require adjacent multiple court use at specific times. They may be recurring use or one-time (or infrequent) use.

An annual schedule of court usage by organized groups will be prepared at the end of summer by the tennis professional and representative members from the tennis membership. Groups wishing to request time for league play should submit their requests to the tennis office.

If more groups request a time slot than there are available courts, a lottery system will be used to determine which groups will be scheduled.

Weekdays:

- Prime Time: During the first three sessions of prime time, no courts may be scheduled for league play. During the final session of prime time no more than six (6) courts may be designated for group play on any given day. At least 50% of players in the group must be Tennis Club Members.
- Open Time: No more than six (6) courts may be reserved at a given time slot by the same group. At least 50% of the group must be Tennis Club Members.

Weekends:

- Prime Time and Open Time: Group play may be scheduled at any time during Saturday or Sunday. If the group is scheduled during the first two prime time slots, all members of the group must be tennis club members. If the group is scheduled in the last two prime time slots or in open time, at least 50% of the group must be Tennis Club Members. No more than six (6) courts may be reserved at a given time slot by the same group.

1.5 Court reservations for Tennis Club Tournaments and Social Events

The tennis club is responsible for sponsoring tournaments and social events for members and guests. An annual schedule of such events will be developed jointly by the Tennis Club and Tennis Professional. These events may occur during Prime Time or Open Time and may include non-member participation as well as Member participation.

Tennis Club Tournaments and Events will have priority over Group Programs and League play.

1.6 Walk on options for members and residents

Unused courts are available on first come basis at any time - prime time or open time. They may be used by any IronOaks Tennis Club Member or any IronOaks Resident. The Member or Resident must sign in at the fitness/tennis desk. Residents should be prepared to show their IronOaks ID card.

1.7 Tennis Clinics and Lessons

Clinics and Lessons may be offered by the Staff Tennis Pro. The times for these may be reserved in advance of the usual reservation time by the Tennis Pro. If reservations for clinics and lessons are not recorded in advance of the 1 pm call in time, the "teaching court" will be available for scheduling by member.

- Lessons and clinics for Members may be scheduled for Prime Time or Open Time
- Lessons and clinics for non-members must be scheduled for Open Time

Any outside Tennis Professionals who conduct fee-based clinics or lessons using the IronOaks tennis courts must first execute a contract with the HOA. They must provide evidence of liability insurance and agree to pay a service fee to the HOA. Lessons or clinics conducted by outside professionals must be scheduled by a Member and are subject to the following restrictions.

- All students must be Tennis Club Members
- Reservation for the court must be made by a Member

- Lessons are encouraged to be scheduled for Open Times but may be scheduled during the last two prime time slots. If scheduled for prime time lessons should involve at least three Members.

1.8 Ball Machine

The ball machine is available to Members and may be used as a walk-on option whenever the court is not in use. The ball machine may not be used when the adjacent court is being used for organized play such as leagues or tournaments.

1.9 Guests

During Prime Time, a guest is defined as a person who is not a Member of the Tennis Club. A guest must be sponsored by a Member and must check in at the front desk and pay a guest fee.

During Open Time, a guest is defined as a person who is neither a Member of the Tennis Club nor a Resident of IronOaks. During these times, each Resident or Member may bring one guest.

2.0 Tennis Club

Members who have paid dues shall automatically be considered members of the IronOaks Tennis Club. This Club will function to assure an active program of social events and tournaments.

The Club shall establish a charter and by-laws that define an organizational structure of officers and committees, a system of meetings and elections, and a framework for carrying out its programs. The Club will have authority and responsibility for such programs as:

1. Club tournaments
2. Social play for members and interclub mixers
3. Member rating system
4. Club handbook
5. Publicity

The Club may set fees for participation in any Club sponsored event, may set dues and will be responsible for its own budget and finances.

The Club may reserve all courts, including Ironwood, for club-sponsored socials, interclub mixers, tournaments or other events.

PICKLEBALL

1.0 Pickleball Facilities

The IronOaks Pickleball courts are located behind tennis court 8. The facilities are owned by IronOaks Homeowners Association and their use is under the jurisdiction of the IronOaks Board of Directors.

Smooth-soled, non-marking shoes and appropriate attire, including shirts, must be worn.

Children under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by an adult at all times. The Pickleball court(s) are to be used for Pickleball only. Skateboarding, rollerblading, and other similar sports or activities are not allowed on the courts.

No smoking or alcoholic beverages are permitted on the court(s).

1.1 Pickleball Membership

Individuals who have paid the annual fee set by the IronOaks Board of Directors for Pickleball Membership or Tennis Membership will be considered Pickleball Members. Pickleball members may reserve pickleball courts in advance.

1.2 Prime Time and Open Time

Oakwood Pickleball hours shall be designated as Prime Time and Open Time.

Prime time shall consist of the first six hours of scheduled play time each day.

From October through April, prime time will be 7:30 am to 1:30 pm. From May through September prime time hours may be adjusted based on a consensus recommendation of the Members.

Open Time shall consist of all hours after Prime Time until dark.

1.3 Court reservation system for Pickleball Court

The courts may be reserved by Pickleball Club Members in 90 minute increments. IronOaks Pickleball Club Members may make reservations for court time any time after noon 2 days in advance of the date of play. Non-Members may not make reservations. Section 1.6 below describes walk-on options for non-Members.

Holders of the reservation must claim the court within 10 min of the scheduled start time or the court will be considered unused and may be reassigned. If the court has been reassigned, the reservation shall have been forfeited.

1.4 Court reservations for Group Programs and Leagues

Group programs and leagues are planned for the future and will be announced once the Pickleball Club is formed.

1.5 Court reservations for Pickleball Club Tournaments and Social Events

The Pickleball Club is responsible for sponsoring tournaments and social events for members and guests. These events may occur during Prime Time or Open Time and may include non-member participation as well as Member participation.

Pickleball Club Tournaments and Events will have priority over Group Programs and League play.

1.6 Walk on options for members and residents

When not reserved, courts are available on a first come basis during prime time or open time.

Courts may be used by any IronOaks Pickleball Club Member or by any IronOaks Resident if not previously reserved. The Club Member or HOA Resident must sign in at the fitness/tennis desk (and sign a liability waiver form for your first use of the courts. Residents should be prepared to show their IronOaks ID card.

1.7 Guests

During Prime Time a guest is defined as a person who is not a Member of the Pickleball Club. A guest must be sponsored by a Member and must check in at the front desk and pay a guest fee.

During Open Time a guest is defined as a person who is neither a Member of the Pickleball Club nor a Resident of IronOaks. During these times, each Resident or Member may bring one guest.

2.0 Pickleball Club

Members who have paid dues shall automatically be considered members of the IronOaks Pickleball Club. This Club will function to assure an active program of social events and tournaments.

The Club shall establish a charter and by-laws that define an organizational structure of officers and committees, a system of meetings and elections, and a framework for carrying out its programs. The Club will have authority and responsibility for such programs as:

1. Club tournaments
2. Social play for members
3. Lessons and clinics
4. Club handbook
5. Publicity

The Club may set fees for participation in any Club sponsored event, may set dues and will be responsible for its own budget and finances.

The Club may reserve all courts for club-sponsored other events.
